Cllrs Bryan O'Reilly, Phil Wagg & I represented the Parish Council at the Remembrance Sunday service held in Barby Church on 9th November. During the service I had the privilege and honour of laying a wreath at the War Memorial on behalf of the Parish Council and all Parishioners.

Thank you to Mr & Mrs Taylor for all their work with the Remembrance preparations in the Parish; for organising the door-to-door poppy selling, for placing poppies on lamp posts and for the remembrance displays around the War Memorial itself. Thanks also go to Cllr Wagg for mowing the grass around the Memorial in readiness for the Remembrance services.

The Parish Council organised for the street lights in Onley to be repaired and are most grateful to OPSL for covering the cost of this work as a goodwill gesture to the residents of Onley. We are organising for a new stock of bottled water to be donated by HMP Onley. This will be kept in Onley and used as needed during any future water outages.

The two 'maximum speed' road signs on Cart Hill, Barby have now been installed and byway EC23 that runs parallel to Cart Hill is being made more accessible. We are still pursing West Northants Council to make permanent improvements to the whole Northamptonshire section of Barby Lane but progress is slow. The work planned on Norman's Bridge (bridge over canal on Barby Lane) was postponed last month and has now been scheduled under a road closure on 4th & 5th December.

The recent tree survey that the Parish Council commissioned unfortunately confirmed the presence of Ash Dieback Disease in some of the magnificent Ash trees at the Sports Field in Barby. Ash Dieback disease is an International problem and is now widespread across all of the UK. Councils in the UK are working hard to manage the situation appropriately with public safety being the prime consideration

The Parish Council is here to represent and serve all Parishioners. Please do let us know of any problems or improvements that you would like made in the Parish. We are looking at putting together our strategic plan for the next 3 years which will enable us to budget more effectively and make improvements to the Parish. We will be providing more information on this early next year and will very much appreciate everybody's input into the development of the plan.
