Life-saving Defibrillators The Parish Council have secured two Defibrillators from the OurJay Foundation via grants given by Three Shires Hospital in Northampton. OurJay Foundation (www.ourjay.org.uk) aims to raise awareness of the importance of having 24/7 publicly accessible automated external defibrillators. They also raise funds and obtain sponsorship to purchase and install accessible defibrillators in this area. The inspirational Chair of the Foundation, Naomi, set up the OurJay Foundation after her 18-year-old son, Jamie, tragically died in 2022 following a cardiac arrest.

One of the defibrillators has already been installed on the outside of Onley Village Hall and connected to the 999 Circuit.

The Parish Council would like to express sincere thanks to the wonderful Babu at the Arnold Arms Pub in Barby for agreeing for the second defibrillator to be installed outside the pub. It is heart-warming that a new member of our Parish wishes to help our whole community in such a positive manner. Thank you Babu & the Arnold Arms.

The Parish Council would also like to thank Lewis Marks from Top Marks Electrical (www.topmarkelectrical.com) for agreeing to install both devices free of charge.

Streetlights The Parish Council are working with Eon, who repair and maintain the streetlights, to develop a scheme where faulty streetlights are replaced more quickly. As part of our strategic plan, we are also looking at sites within Barby that need additional street lighting. Please do let us know if you have any suggestions.

Speeding The Parish Council has submitted a grant application to replace the two speed vehicle activation signs on Daventry Road with up-to-date and hopefully more effective devices.

Strategic Plan The development of the Parish Council's three-year strategic plan continues, led by Cllr Phil Wagg. Please do let him or I know of any improvements you would like to see in the Parish over the next three years or any projects that you would like the Parish Council to consider funding.

Onley Thank you to everyone who attended our open event in Onley regarding the new playground and to all those that responded to our online survey – we had an excellent response and can now progress to the next stage of the grant application. The Parish Council have arranged for overhanging shrubbery by the Officer's Mess in Onley to be cut back and are purchasing and installing a sign to direct drivers to Onley Village Hall car parking

Naomi has worked tirelessly to provide accessible defibrillators to hundreds of places. Her aim is to have defibrillators in every police vehicle as one of the first people to arrive at the scene for Jamie was a police car. Naomi brought a defibrillator and manikins with her and gave a thorough presentation on how to use the equipment. We were all encouraged to have a go, many questions were asked and by the end we felt we would be able to help if called on.

Our March meeting was our AGM which was followed by cheese and wine. We welcomed 3 new members. Our President was voted in for a further year and the committee will be formed at the first committee meeting in April. The 26/27 programme can be seen on the Village Hall notice board; there is something for everyone. 
