Dog Fouling Thank you to residents who continue to pick up after their dogs. Dog waste can be disposed of in either a dog waste or any litter bin, or take it home and place it, suitably wrapped, in your own waste bin. Please do not dump the bag in a hedge or elsewhere as this is littering which carries the same penalty as dog fouling. Street Lighting and Highways Issues Any highways issues, that are not concerning street lights, can be reported to West Northamptonshire Council on the Fix My Street website https://www.fixmystreet.com/. If you notice any street lights which aren't working please contact the Parish Clerk.

The Parish Council arranged for the hedges to be cut around Barby playing field and for more wood bark to be delivered & spread onto the 'safety area' at Barby playground.

The Parish Council are still persisting in trying to get West Northants Council to make improvements to Barby Lane. Advisory 20 mph speed signs have been installed in both directions on Cart Hill bend

An arboriculturist has carried out safety checks on Parish Trees that are the responsibility of the Parish Council and required a two-year safety check. The recommended/necessary tree safety work will be instigated. Public safety is of paramount importance to the Parish Council

The refurbishment project to the play area in Onley is progressing and we hope to have three possible lay out options to share with Parishioners in the near future.

Unfortunately, at the time of writing, we have no further timescales for the water pipe replacement scheme at Onley nor a timescale from the MOJ regarding their instigation of a new scheme for charging Onley residents for water.

Parish Council Vacancies We do currently have two vacancies for Councillors. You do not need to have any experience, just a desire to improve & support your community. We meet once per month and Councillors are also involved in other projects within the Parish. Barby & Onley Parish Council is aware that a St George flag has recently been affixed to a streetlamp within Barby. The Parish Council has also received some email communication from residents regarding this. No permission has been sought or granted by the Parish Council for the installation of this flag.

As the responsibility for Highways rests with West Northants Council the Parish Council is acting in accordance with their guidance. Below is West Northants safety advice & information that they are providing to residents

We (West Northants Council) are urging people not to attach flags or other items to street furniture, including lampposts, road signs, and traffic infrastructure.

These actions pose serious safety risks - not only to those attempting to climb and fix items, but also to other members of the public and motorists. Lampposts are not designed to support the weight of ladders or individuals, and there is a very real danger of falls or electrocution. Such distractions can also impact road safety.

Under the Highways Act 1980, it is an offence to fix items to lampposts without the consent of the Highway Authority, and this legal requirement remains in force. Industry experts and agencies continue to issue similar warnings.

The Council may remove the flag at the time of the routine street light maintenance


