### **AN IMPORTANT PLANNING MATTER AFFECTING YOUR COMMUNITY**

**Planning Application – 2023/5783/MAF (revised) from Cadman Sporting, Barby Lane, Barby**

This application is decided upon by West Northants Council. The current application does not propose any change to the existing consented shooting operations. Instead, it seeks planning permission solely for the creation of additional earth bunds and associated landscaping. The material to build the bunds will comprise of 'arising from construction sites in the Rugby and Daventry area'. The NEW proposed construction vehicle access route being from the A428, near Houlton (behind Tesco Warehouse at DIRFT) and down Nortoft Lane to a new site access in Nortoft Lane,

Following public feedback, the Parish Council understand that the community are overwhelmingly against the plans therefore we resolved to OBJECT to the application on the following two main grounds -

**1 IMPACT ON OUR HIGHWAY NETWORK** The single track, badly-maintained Nortoft Lane cannot sustain the 53,000 32-tonne HGV movements proposed over the two years that will be required to build these bunds, with up to 260 HGV movements per day.

**2 IMPACT OF DEVELOPMENT ON PREVAILING CHARACTER IN THE AREA.** The development land is within the Rainsbrook Valley in an area officially classified as 'Broad Unwooded Vale' which is generally flat and open character, with wide panoramas across an expansive landscape - the building of 1.13 miles of additional bunds which are over 26 foot high does not respect the distinctive landscape character of the area and is contrary to policy ENV 8 of our NDP. The bunds will be an 'unacceptable visual intrusion' upon our landscape

As the development will have a profound effect on our Community, we would encourage everyone to comment by using the below link. Comments to be submitted by 9<sup>th</sup> June (the Parish Council have obtained an extension to the published date). ## **Free sim cards to help people get online**

People who are struggling to afford to get online may be able to access a free sim card from West Northamptonshire libraries as part of a new scheme. The library service is working with the Good Things Foundation's National Databank initiative, which helps people facing digital hardship to stay connected by providing sim cards offering free data, calls and texts, supplied by Vodafone, Three, Virgin and O2.

If you know someone aged 18 or over who is on a low income and has little or no internet access, please tell them to pop into their nearest council-managed library and speak to a member of staff to find out if they qualify.

Following Government advice, Parish Councillors now have 'gov.uk' email addresses. Details can be found on the back page of this newsletter. Our new Parish Council Website has been completed and is undergoing final testing prior to full launch.

Unfortunately, there has been some delay, caused by suppliers, in obtaining quotes to repair the roundabout in Barby Park. The Parish Council are doing everything possible to get this item of play equipment back in operation as soon as we can.

In addition to the tree management work (mentioned last month) that is being carried out as a result of our triennial tree survey, the Parish Council are also adopting a tree planting policy which is predominately in partnership with Barby Cricket Club. This is intended to form the foundation of a long-term approach to managing and enhancing the tree stock within the Parish for the benefit of the community and future generations.

Thank you to everyone who attended the Annual Parish Meeting and to all those who gave talks about their organisations or Clubs. It was very interesting to hear about so many different activities & events that are taking place in the Parish

## **BARBY & ONLEY PARISH COUNCIL REPORT APRIL 2025 TO MARCH 2026**

Parish Council Elections were held on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025. As only 9 of the previous Councillors stood for election it was uncontested. Our thanks for their service go to former Councillors Gareth James & Kirsty Towney who were unable to stand for election due to work commitments. During the year we were sad to see the resignations of Councillors Jane Pollard & Adrian Cooper but pleased to welcome Conor Benton who was co-opted onto the Council in September.

The revision of our neighbourhood development plan passed a Parish referendum on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025 with over 89% voting in favour and it is now part of the statutory development plan for West Northamptonshire.

Any planning decisions on housing and the environment, within the Parish, are now made with reference to the Plan.

Planning decisions are made by West Northants Council although the Parish Council is a consultee. During the past year the Parish Council was consulted on 17 planning & planning-related applications. We were also consulted on West Northants Council's own Local Development Plan. The Parish Council objected to the allocation of 58 new homes within Barby and requested that the Northamptonshire section of the Rainsbrook Valley should be designated as an area of special Landscape Sensitivity.

We were also consulted on Rugby Borough Council's Local Plan and objected to the housing developments proposed for Hillmorton and the possibility of the Lodge Farm Development. We also encouraged West Northants Council to submit an objection to Rugby Council regarding these two potential development areas.

We were pleased to see that the latest version of Rugby's local plan did not include the Hillmorton nor Lodge Farm developments, both of which would have had a detrimental impact upon our Parish.

In December the Parish Council set its budget for the financial year starting 1<sup>st</sup> April 2026 and resolved that there would be no increase to the precept, which is the amount of the Council tax that each household pays to the Parish Council. We ended the financial year March 2026 well within budget, the surplus will be committed to reserves for future community projects. The Parish Council has also paid off a long-standing public works loan and entered into an agreement with EON to ensure that the time to repair faulty street lighting is reduced

Under the leadership of Cllr Phil Wagg, the Parish Council is developing a strategic plan that will set out the key priorities it will focus on for the next 3 years. The plan is being formulated through pro-active engagement with residents and will highlight the projects that Parishioners wish to see the Council develop and fund.

Time will not allow me to mention all of the Council's achievements over the past year, hence I will summarise just a few.

In Onley, the Parish Council have purchased new metal waste bin inserts, new grit bins and a new Village Hall parking sign. We arranged for the removal of fly tipping and overgrowth from the area behind the garage block and re-landscaped an area outside the mess hall. We facilitated the repair of the long-term street light outage and have been liaising with and lobbying the MOJ over the proposed water pipe replacement project and resident water charging procedures. We also instigated the support of our MP Stuart Andrew and have been working with him to improve communication with the MOJ.

The Parish Council held a public consultation over the proposed new Onley Playground project and will be going to tender and grant submission in the near future. Our thanks to Cllrs Sarah Withington, Dawn Cotton and Conor Benton for organising the consultation.

In Barby, the Parish Council have repaired the fencing around the tennis courts and cleared out the drainage ditches in that area. We have purchased a history information board that will be installed on the Green. The board was proposed and designed by Barby Local History Group. We have also purchased and installed a new bench and waste bin on the Ware.

We have given grants to Barby Village Hall to assist with the funding of a new CCTV system and to Onley Village Hall for re-wiring works. We have also agreed to provide a grant to Barby Cricket Club to assist with the funding of new practice nets.

In July, the Parish Council, organised the community speed watch program under the leadership of Cllr Nigel Gove. The Council have also purchased its own vehicle speed recording device. The Parish Council applied for and was awarded a grant from the Northamptonshire Police Commissioner for the purchase of two replacement vehicle activated speed devices for Daventry Road in Barby. West Northants Council eventually installed the speed warning signs on Cart Hill that the Parish Council had instigated.

The Parish Council secured & arranged the installation of two 24/7 public accessible defibrillators from the Our Jay Foundation. One has been fitted to the outside of Onley Village Hall and the other to the outside of the Arnold Arms, our grateful thanks go to the landlord of the Arnold Arms, Babu, for kindly agreeing for this to happen.

Councillors Bryan O'Reilly, Phil Wagg & I had the honour of representing and placing a wreath on behalf of the Council and all Parishioners at our Parish war memorial on Remembrance Sunday.

Parish Councillors have changed over to gov.uk email addresses in line with national advice and the Parish Council now has a new website. Thank you to Cllrs Bryan O'Reilly, Phil Wagg & Tom Hallam for facilitating this.

The Parish Council is here to represent & serve all residents. We cannot do this without knowing what Parishioners would want us to change or to improve within the Parish. To help us facilitate this we continue to engage with as many Parishioners as possible. We do this by having a visible presence at the Breakfast Club in Barby every month, attending fetes and fun days in Barby & Onley and having a presence at as many other Parish events as possible.

I would like to finish by thanking everyone within our Parish who gives up their time to improve our Communities & to make our Parish such a great place to live.

Thank you to all those involved with the organising & running of clubs, charities, groups, events & organisations.

Our thanks go to Christine Dover, editor of the Parish newsletter, without whose time and dedication, the newsletter would not be published each month. The Parish Council would also like to sincerely thank Michael McCormick who has most conscientiously delivered all the newsletters in Barby for many years.

It is right that the Parish Council should thank everyone that gets involved and supports our communities but I would also like to thank all those who take on the role of Parish Councillor and continue to serve our communities in such a direct and active way. Without the dedication and work of our Parish Councillors nothing that I have mentioned tonight would have been possible. All the work that Parish Councillors undertake is entirely voluntary and Councillors give up a considerable amount of their time to work to improve our communities. Hence a sincere thanks to all Councillors over the past year and our thanks to our Clerk, Katrina, for all of her hard work & support.
