Introduction


Barby and Onley Parish Council organised a drop-in event on Neighbourhood Planning which was held on 18 March 2023. The events took place in Barby between 10:00 am and 11:30 am and in Onley between 12:00 pm and 1:30 pm.

The aim of this event was to help engage the community in the Neighbourhood Plan Review and to seek comments on the continued suitability of the policies – including important open spaces and environment; community facilities and amenities; housing and design and employment. The opportunity was taken to share potential new policies and to seek feedback. Further questions were asked about aspects of Parish life that residents like and dislike.

The drop-in event was promoted through social media, an article in a newsletter distributed throughout the Parish and through word of mouth.

In total, 64 people attended the event in Barby and 30 at Onley (94 in total). Several additional people signed up to become involved in the process.

SM returns - 51 (includes some that input data during open event, but data not duplicated) 4 additional comments by email – making an overall total of 149.







Format of Event

Attendees were welcomed on arrival and asked to complete a contact sheet or to tick a box to record their attendance. The arrangements for the day were explained.

The first displays introduced neighbourhood planning and described the process that is being followed by the Parish Council. Copies of explanatory booklets were available for reference.

Consultation on key issues

A series of display boards were spread across the room, each of which focused on a different policy, including:


Housing – mix, design and heritage Environment – existing designations and Local Green Space criteria Employment Community Facilities Infrastructure


People were invited to read the displays and the information available and to make comment on 'post-it' notes to indicate continued support for the policies.

A further display concentrated on design elements of housing and encouraged participants to identify features they welcomed and those that are to be avoided.




The following pages give a sample of the boards that were on display at the event. The boards posed questions which people were invited to comment on.

Summary

There was strong support for the Vision Statement.

There was no disagreement with the policy on general development principles and 28 in favour. Comments included concern to retain the village boundary and to protect green spaces.

32 people supported the design policy with no dissent. A range of comments included the need for new development to be in keeping and sustainable, but also support for modern housing.

The policy on water management received 31 in support with none against.

24 people supported the policy on the scale and type of housing. Mixed views were expressed in relation to building in gardens. **14**

17 people voted against the policy on development in the countryside – but this appears to have been mistaken for being against development in the countryside rather than being against the policy (which seeks to protect the countryside). Only 3 expressed support for the policy.

The policy on tenure, type and size of houses was supported by 7 people, with 1 against. Bungalows were the most popular housing type.

Policies on existing and new employment were supported by 12 and 7 people respectively. There was some support for new small businesses.

The policy on Local Green Spaces was supported by 32 residents with no opposition and the policy on Open Spaces has support of 36 people with none against.

27 people supported the policy on footpaths with 1 against. People commented on the need to maintain the existing footpaths.

31 people supported the policy protecting existing community facilities whilst 29 people expressed support for the range of infrastructure measures identified.

People were invited to comment on 6 potential new policies:

The potential policy on Village Confines received support from 6 people, with most respondents wishing the boundary to remain the same.

A potential policy on renewable energy was supported by 13 people with none in dissent.

A policy promoting a residential allocation in the NP was supported by 7 residents. Comments supported small-scale development and affordable housing, with one comment against any further development.

A policy supporting home working was endorsed by 7 people recognising the importance of good internet speeds.

4 people expressed support for a policy on school expansion if adequate car parking could be provided. 2 were against.

A policy on important local buildings was supported by 8 people with 2 against. Comments included the need to recognise locally important buildings.




