<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The next meeting of the Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **Monday 12**th **April 2021** at 7.30pm. The meeting will be held via zoom online and joining instructions will be published on the front of the agenda which will be available on the parish website

www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk and the noticeboards. Parishioners are welcome to attend the online meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then join the meeting and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

Meetings are held on the second Monday of each month at 7.30pm and usually finish by 9.30pm.

LOCAL ELECTIONS 6TH MAY

<u>Parish Council Elections</u> - All the current Parish Councillors reach the end of their term of office in May, and 11 people are needed to form the new Parish Council.

There is still time to fill in a nomination paper and stand as a Councillor.

Completed nomination papers must be **hand-delivered** to Daventry District Council Offices by **4pm on Thursday 8th April 2021.**

To fill in the form, you need a proposer and seconder from the parish, and you have to include their name and electoral roll number on the form. This number can be obtained from the election office 01327 302321 or from the parish clerk email <u>clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk</u>

<u>West Northamptonshire Council</u> - On 1st April 2021 Daventry District Council and Northamptonshire Council will be replaced by the new West Northamptonshire Council which will deliver all services that are currently provided by Daventry District and Northamptonshire Councils.

<u>**Parish Verges</u>** - The rotavated verge near the new cherry trees on Rugby Road has been planted with wild flower seed and it is hoped that it should look lovely in the summer. Wildflowers have also been sown behind the seat on "The Ware" and the area in front of the flagpole in Barby has been extended.</u>

We are aware that the verges have taken a real hammering this winter with both the very wet weather and the work being carried out by Gigaclear. It is now the start of the mowing season so please make sure that you do not park vehicles on the grass verge as this prevents the mowing contractors from cutting the grass.

Gigaclear will make good the verges they have dug up, and the parish council will consider whether any further remedial works are required.

<u>Highway Works</u> – The work to install the new safety barriers over the M45 is nearly complete and Nortoft Lane should reopen on 2^{nd} April,

Any **potholes** you come across can be reported to Northamptonshire Highways for repair via <u>www.fixmystreet.com</u> or telephone 0300 126 1000 8am to 6pm Mon to Friday or 07000 782112 outside those hours.

You will be provided with a reference number for your report so that you can go back and check what is being done to rectify the problem.

Fly Tipping - A pilot scheme has been set up by the Northamptonshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner to support farmers and landowners to remove flytipping from their land free of charge and to put in place measures to prevent it happening again. Local councils do not remove fly-tipped waste on private land, that is the responsibility of the landowner, however councils do investigate reports of fly tipping. Under this scheme farmers and private landowners can report flytipping on their land and the authority will arrange for the fly tip to be cleared – with the cost being met by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner. Dogs – Please remember that dogs are not allowed in the allotments, play areas, Barby Sports Field, or the Millennium Orchard behind Barby Tennis Court. Please also continue to clean up after your dogs and keep Barby and Onley as clean and tidy as possible.

Covid -19 Community based testing (for people without symptoms) - A new testing centre has opened at Daventry Leisure Centre. This complements the existing provision in Northampton, Corby, Wellingborough and Brackley and offers a more local testing venue for those in Daventry and the surrounding areas. Lateral Flow Device testing is otherwise known as rapid testing and is used in people who do not have symptoms of Covid-19. The aim is to identify the one in three people who may be infectious without being aware in order to reduce spread of the virus. Rapid testing enables swift action to be taken to protect colleagues and family members of those who test positive with COVID-19 and to reduce any onward risk of transmission.

The new site is open Tuesday to Saturday from 9.30am to 12pm and 1pm to 6.30pm, providing a wide variety of testing slots. Each test involves a swab of the mouth and nose and provides a result within 30 minutes.
