

Parish Council Meetings – The next meeting of the Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on Monday 8th February 2021 at 7.30pm. The meeting will be held via Zoom online and joining instructions will be published on the front of each agenda which will be available on the parish website

www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk 3 days before the meetings. Parishioners are welcome to attend the online meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then join the meeting and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an

answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

<u>Parish Council Elections</u> - All members of the current Parish Council will come to the end of their term of office in May 2021. The elections have been postponed due to Coronavirus, but every attempt will be made to ensure that they go ahead on **Thursday** 6th **May 2021**.

Parish Councils can play a vital role in climate change, reducing loneliness and social isolation, spotting and filling in gaps left by principal councils and taking more responsibility for the development (or conservation) of the built and natural environment. Please consider whether you would like to become a councillor and help make a difference in our community. Nominations for election are likely to close at the beginning of April 2021, so all candidates will have to have been recruited by then. Please consider whether you would like to stand for election as a parish councillor in May and look out for further details nearer the time about how to put your name forward.

Please note that the dates for these elections are currently under review and may be postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

<u>Covid-19</u> - Although we have not been ordered to close the village play areas during this current lockdown, can parents please remember, that you need to keep your distance, use hand sanitizer and wash your hands when you get home if you take your children to the park to play. Thanks

<u>Police Liaison Officer</u> - Dominic Fisher has kindly agreed to be the point of contact between the Parish Council and the police. Please phone 999 for urgent police matters, or 101 for non-urgent matters, but if you need any help in who to speak to, then have a word with Dom (07855 821432) who may be able to help.

<u>Census 2021</u> - Census day is 21st March 2021. Find out more at <u>www.census.gov.uk</u>. The census is carried out every 10 years. It helps us understand what our society needs now and what it's likely to need in the future. The information it collects helps plan and fund services in your area. This could include transport, education and healthcare. Charities also use census information to help get the funding they need. Businesses use it to decide where to set up, which creates job opportunities. Census 2021 will help give the best picture of the needs of everyone living in England and Wales.

A total of 94% of people took part in the last census, helping each area receive its share of public funding. Without the census, it would be much more difficult to provide the services you and your community need.

You must complete the census by law. If you do not, or if you supply false information, you could be fined up to £1,000.

There will be a lot more information available nearer the time to explain what you are required to do. You will be receiving a letter in the next few weeks about how to complete the census and we will all be encouraged to complete it online this time.

Could you be a 'Walking Befriender?' - An 88yr old lady in Barby village, who recently had a fall, has lost some of her confidence to go out on her own. Is there anyone willing to volunteer as a walking befriender? She would like someone 'to be by her side when she goes to the local shop/post office'. Barby Village Hall Defibrillator Checker — Is there anyone in the village who would be prepared, on a weekly basis, to check the Barby Village Hall defibrillator? It's an easy job and involves checking that the green rescue light is on, that the pads and batteries are in the case and in date, and that the cabinet is not wet inside, and that the key pad and door opens easily. The defibrillator is registered with the Ambulance Service, so that they know where it is, and can guide someone to it in an emergency. They also alert us if it has been used so that the pads can be restocked, and battery checked. If you can help by carrying out these weekly checks then it would be much appreciated. <u>Parking</u> – Please can people be careful not to park on pavements as it makes it difficult for parents with pushchairs and those with walking difficulties to pass.

<u>Dogs</u> – Please remember that dogs are not allowed in the allotments, play areas, Barby Sports Field, or the Millennium Orchard behind Barby Tennis Court.

Please also continue to clean up after your dogs and keep Barby and Onley as clean and tidy as possible.

<u>Highway Works</u> - New safety barriers are going to be installed on the roads that cross the M45 at the beginning of February. The closure dates of the roads affected are:

Onley Lane 25th January to 12th February

Barby, Hillmorton Lane 15th February 2021 to 5th March

Nortoft Lane 8th March to 26th March

Signed diversion routes will be in place and access to businesses will remain available during these times.

Gigaclear are currently installing ultrafast full fibre broadband cables in Barby as part of Northamptonshire County Council's Superfast Northamptonshire project. We have been assured that once the work is finished, they will come back to restore the verges that have been damaged. Thanks to all for your patience whilst this work is being carried out.

West Northamptonshire Council (WNC) Draft Budget - The first ever draft budget for West Northamptonshire Council is out for consultation - In a joint statement Cllr Ian McCord, Leader of the West Northants Shadow Authority and Anna Earnshaw, Chief Executive, West Northamptonshire Council said "The formation of West Northamptonshire Council is a fresh start for this area of our county and the budget consultation offers people the chance to be part of our plans for the future. By uniting the councils in the west of the county we can pool our many strengths and move positively forward so we can deliver quality services efficiently. We want to hear what people have to say to make sure we get it right Proposals include a council tax increase of 4.99%, comprising 1.99% core tax and a 3% adult social care precept. Novelty was everywhere; something different that wasn't threatening, unlike the something different that was. Nearly twelve months on, novelty has worn thin - as novelty does. The prospect of another Lent and Easter without being able to gather in church tends to only add to the misery this pandemic has brought. Are there other ways we might share in worship together or just 'meet up'? Have you become more 'tech savvy' during lockdown? As the long-haul becomes an even longer long-haul, perhaps we should all be better 'kitted up' to better enable community conversation? We would be interested to hear your thoughts.

Though services are off the menu, the Church is being opened every day. (at least for now.) So long as we remember all the rules when we go in it is a safe place for individual prayer; a space to go and be, away from the madding world/home/work - hopefully not crowd - for a while. Please observe the request for masks and hand sanitising and please sign in or use the NHS app. This offers a calm place to be in a time of stress.

For Ash Wednesday (Feb 17th) an interactive service is being planned and for Lent we hope to have some study material. On Sundays, a sound file for Morning Prayer will continue to be sent out, as will a second file with the Gospel and a reflection.
