### Parish Council News (Parish Clerk 01788 891184)

<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The next meeting of the Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **Monday 14**<sup>th</sup> **June 2021** at 7.30pm in the **main hall** of Barby Village Hall. As always, members of the parish are welcome to join the meeting and raise any issues they wish during the period of public participation. Please note that masks must be worn, and social distance maintained to comply with Government restrictions in place to limit the spread of Covid-19.

Central Government put legislation in place last April that allowed Parish and Town Councils to hold meetings on line as a safety measure to protect people from Corona-19. This legislation lapsed on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2021. The Government extended the legislation for themselves, however in England Town and Parish meetings have had to go back to a face-to-face format from 7<sup>th</sup> May. The High Court case against the Government to try and get this ruling overturned ruled that the High Court did not make law, and therefore could not overturn Government law. In Barby & Onley we aim to investigate running hybrid meetings if we can find an easy way to make this work so that all the meetings are easy for people to access in whatever format suits them best. This will obviously be dependent on whether it is legally permissible.

<u>Welcome to a new Parish Council</u> - The May meeting of the Parish Council was not only the first face to face meeting for a year, but it was also the first meeting of the new council term, where the newly elected councillors took office and signed the relevant paperwork. This meeting was also the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council where the councillors elect a chairman and vice-chairman for the year.

The ten councillors who were elected unopposed for the eleven seats are listed on page 11 of the newsletter and on the website. Both Sadie Milligan and Sarah Withington are new to the role. Both live in Onley Park meaning that Onley Park is now represented by 4 councillors on the Parish Council.

Paul Reynolds was elected as chairman for the year with Steve Gee as vicechairman. Nigel Gove will continue to oversee the parish finances and double check that the clerk is paying people correctly.

The annual meeting of the parish council also reviewed its policy documents, standing orders, financial regulations and insurance arrangements.

<u>West Northamptonshire Council</u> - The councillors who have been elected to represent this area (Braunston & Crick Ward) on West Northamptonshire Council (which has replaced Northamptonshire County and Daventry District Councils) are Malcolm Longley, Alan Chantler and Rosie Humphreys. https://www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk/Other Elected Representatives 6 997.aspx. They should be able to help with any issues that are not the responsibility of the Parish Council such as highways, schools, social services, housing and refuse collection.

<u>Litter Picking</u>- Anyone wanting some exercise who fancies a spot of litter-picking, please contact the clerk who will provide bin liners, gloves, hi-vis vests and litter pickers for you to use.

<u>Unknown Tommy Silhouettes</u> - As a mark of respect to those people who have served our country in times of war the Parish Council has purchased "Unknown Tommy" silhouettes, one of which will be erected at Onley Park and one in Barby. It is 100 years since the British Legion was formed, and they have supplied them.

<u>Speedwatch</u> - Usually at this time of year we would be appealing for people to help man the hand-held speed guns as part of the "Speedwatch" initiative to slow the traffic through the village. Anyone caught speeding is sent a warning letter. We have been notified that Speedwatch will not take place during 2021, as it had to be cancelled due to Covid-19 and it is now rescheduled for 2022. Thanks very much to all those who have been trained to use the speed gun in the past, and once we get some dates for training events, we will be asking for more volunteers to be trained to take part in the 2022 Speedwatch initiative.

<u>Power supply</u> - The recent power-cuts, that seem to be ever more frequent, are particularly annoying for people working from home. Western Power is putting in better high voltage line from Crick in the summer which should help alleviate the problem.

<u>Water Quality at Onley Park</u> - We have been informed that the Ministry of Justice need to supply West Northamptonshire Council with water samples of the drinking water from Onley Park on a regular basis so that the water quality is checked. The MOJ is hopeful of getting funding to upgrade the pipework, although we have been given no indication of the timescale.

**Flag Flying** - The rainbow Pride flag will be flown during the month of June, apart from 5 days designated for flying of the Union flag. <u>Parish Path Warden</u> - Many people have an in-depth knowledge of the local rights of way network and the Parish Path Partnership Scheme set up by Northamptonshire Highways offers an opportunity to formally get active and make sure the rights of way network remain open and accessible for all users to enjoy.

The Role of a Parish Path Warden - Do you love walking and being out in the fresh air and exploring your local area? Northamptonshire Highways looking for people who have a keen eye and are able to consider differing needs as paths may be clear for some users but may be difficult to access for others.

Anyone who regularly walks in their local countryside and community can just note things down if they find an issue or think it may be a problem for others. All you need to do is note the problem down and take a photo if possible, either with a camera or with your phone.

When you come across a path problem e.g., vegetation overgrowth, difficult stile, locked gate, collapsing footbridge, path not made good after ploughing, all you need to do is report it.

Reporting is easy and we have a great public reporting system that is easy to use.

#### Aims of the Parish Path Warden Scheme -

- The main purpose of the scheme is to involve local communities and parish councils in the management of their local rights of way network. This will help ensure that routes are not obstructed, are clearly defined, properly maintained, and hopefully promoted to local people.
- Any rights of way related issues or problems must be reported using Street Doctor, the public reporting system for both the west and north. This process ensures issues are recorded and dealt with appropriately. Once reported you will be issued with a unique reference number and be able to follow the progress of your enquiry.
- Help Northants Highways to make sure all public rights of way are
  properly signposted where they leave a public metalled road by letting us
  know about any missing fingerposts.
- 4. Report back to the parish council meeting at least once a year to keep them up to date with your findings and reports sent in via Street Doctor Also provide information about the condition of the local network and the work being undertaken by the rights of way team to maintain and improve local rights of way in your area.

#### Northamptonshire Highways would never expect you to -

- Enter into correspondence with landowners, farmers or rights of way users.
- Agree to changes to the route of a public right of way. All enquiries about diverting a public right of right of way, adding a right of way to the Definitive Map or removing a public right of way from the Definitive Map should be passed to your local Rights of Way Area Team via Street Doctor.
- 3. Agree to the replacement of rights of way furniture such as gates, stiles and way marking.
- 4. Parish Path Wardens should be aware that they are not authorised to enforce Rights of Way legislation as this could jeopardise or undermine the Rights of Way enforcement procedure.
- Undertake any practical work on the Rights of Way network however minor, including the repair of furniture or cutting back overhanging vegetation. Any repairs and all practical work required must be reported via Street Doctor, our online public reporting system.

What to do next? - If you feel that you, or someone you know, would like to become the Parish Path Warden please send an email to <a href="mailto:clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk">clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk</a> by Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June with the following information: Full name, Telephone number, Email address, whether you are a member of any professional body e.g., Ramblers.

**Training -** Once there is a warden in place, Northamptonshire Highways will be in touch to arrange training sessions. They will support you all the way and initially organise a short induction and talk you through the **Street Doctor** system.
