Parish Council News (Parish Clerk 01788 891184)

<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The next meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **MONDAY 11th OCTOBER 2021 at 7.30pm** in **Onley Village Hall**, Onley Park, Willoughby, Rugby CV23 8AW

Members of the Parish are welcome to attend the parish council meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then come along and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting. Meetings are generally held on the second Monday of each month at 7.30pm and usually finish by 9.30pm.

<u>Councillors</u> - We are very pleased to be able to announce that there is now a full complement of 11 councillors on the Barby & Onley Parish Council. We welcome Faith Gorman who was co-opted to fill the vacant seat at the September meeting.

<u>Planning</u> – At the time of writing no planning application has been registered with the West Northamptonshire Council relating to any proposal regarding Cadman Sporting Club (Barby Sporting Club). It is therefore not appropriate that the subject is discussed at parish council meetings until a planning application has been registered and notified to the parish council.

<u>Barby Parish Noticeboard</u> - Please note that as a temporary measure the agenda and minutes of meetings will be published on the noticeboard outside Barby Village Hall, Kilsby Road. A new noticeboard is on order and will be erected near the village Christmas tree opposite Barby Village stores.

<u>Parish Council 2022/23 Budget</u> - The parish council is now starting to put together its budget for the year starting 1st April 2022.

If any organisation within the village has a project which they would like the parish council to consider providing a grant towards, then please email details of the project, the costs and the money already secured to the parish clerk at clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk and a grant may be considered. The budget will be put together during October and published in draft form in November. The councillors will agree the final form in December and then it has to be submitted to West Northamptonshire Council in January so that they can calculate the level of Council Tax (rates) to collect to meet the financial requirements.

Onley summer fete held Saturday 7th August - On Saturday, 7th August, Onley Park put on a highly successful summer fete for the enjoyment of its residents. This was shared with the help of HMP Onley whose staff assisted in many roles and also provided staff members to aid, on the day, where necessary. A total of a little over £800 was raised, after expenses, which was shared with the prison, their part being used to buy equipment for an outside gym to help with their mental health and our share being saved for future events.

Numerous stalls lined the football pitch adjacent to the village hall and many games, including a bouncy castle were provided for the children. There was an abundance of raffle prizes handed out and many of these came from local businesses who contributed so generously. A special thanks has to be given to the persons involved who managed to secure such amazing prizes in the run up to the event. Food was naturally available and included pizzas, Indian street food and the ubiquitous English BBQ. There was the ever-popular beer stall and artisan coffee was available too.

One of the highlights of the afternoon was a falconry display together with a very humorous and skilled crowd-pleaser cum handler who had obviously gained a polished act from previous such events. Another highlight was provided by the prison of a DJ and group who entertained us for most of the afternoon. This was followed by a 40-piece local Rock Choir who put on an excellent performance.

The sun shone on rare occasions, but it stayed warm and a very pleasant afternoon/evening was had by all.

Many, many thanks to all the helpers, assistants, residents and everyone who supported this hopefully 'first event of many' to be held here at Onley Park.
