<u>Budget</u> for year commencing 1st April 2022. The parish council will be preparing the annual budget in October, so any organisation which wishes to apply for a grant from the Parish Council needs to do so as soon as possible stating how much money they are seeking, what it will be used for, and including a copy of their accounts.

<u>Wild Flowers</u> - The wildflowers are beginning to fade and set seed. They will be cut down in a week or two so that the seed can fall onto the ground, and then the clippings collected up once this has happened. This will hopefully mean that we get a lovely show of flowers again next year.
