<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The next meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **MONDAY 14th FEBRUARY 2022 at 7.30pm** in **Onley Park Village Hall**, Onley Park, Willoughby, Rugby, CV23 8AW

Members of the parish are welcome to attend the parish council meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then come along and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

Meetings are generally held on the second Monday of each month at 7.30pm and usually finish by 9.30pm.

<u>Vacancy for a Parish Councillor</u> - Councillor Andy Sabine has resigned as a councillor as he is moving away from the area. The Parish Council would like to thank him very much for his work on behalf of the parish.

This leaves a vacant seat on the council. Queens Platinum Jubilee-- As most people will already know, the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations to mark 70 years of the Queens reign will take place on 2nd and 3rd June, with two extra bank holidays. <u>Covid Support Fund</u> - Every West Northamptonshire councillor has been allocated £2,500 to support their local community and voluntary groups recover from the impact of Covid. The minimum grant is £200 and cannot be given to individuals, but School PTAs may apply. Overhanging branches - If you have shrubs or trees in your garden that overhang the pavement, take a look and check that people can still walk past them without getting wet or dripped on. Can a baby's buggy get past? If not, then it would be really appreciated it if you can arrange for them to get a pruning.

Highway issues - If you come across a pothole, or other issue on the public highway, or a footpath or pavement, please log the problem with "Fix My Street" <u>https://fixmystreet.northamptonshire.gov.uk/</u> This system provides a reference number so that you can check on the progress made to rectify the problem, and it also means that all problem areas are logged.

<u>Wildflower beds</u> - The parish council is going to increase the size of the wildflower bed around the bench on Ware Road this year and has topped up the seed on the other beds. Hopefully it will provide another lovely display in the summer. We have also been lucky enough to have been given three further cherry trees by the Japanese Embassy, two of which have been planted on Barby Green opposite the village shop, and one has been planted at Onley Park.

Litter Picking - Thanks to those who helped pick up litter from around the village in early January. It would be even better if it wasn't dropped in the first place, so if you see anyone throwing litter out of a car window then take a note of their registration number and report them to the Council on 01327 871100. They can prosecute litterbugs.

The Great British Spring Clean will be held throughout the country from 25th March to 10th April, and the parish council intend to arrange another village litter pick to help clear up the verges on the roads leading into the village. Keep a watch out for the date on social media and if you can spare a couple of hours to help, it would be really appreciated.

Please keep them away from window sills. Ideally if you can keep them in a safe secure faraday pouch to prevent devices being used to scan remotely for your vehicle keys. Notes from St Mary's - Being able to meet, being able to sing, being able to chat over a coffee; things have been getting back to how we now but vaguely remember them. Christmas was celebrated in our churches and the singing of carols, albeit behind masks, generated the feeling of 'goodwill to all' that that season promises. As we look to spring, Lent and Easter there is reason to hope that conditions will allow further freedoms. Things are beginning to look optimistic. Sunday services have been running at 10am for a while now. That is set to continue, though rather than just alternating week on week will now assume 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month as Communion at Barby and 2nd and 4th at Kilsby; with 5th Sundays being a joint service in one of the churches. 10am seems to be the optimum time for most people, so we're trying that in both churches. So, Holy Communion services are on alternate weeks. On the other Sundays there are services of Morning Worship, which are mainly Lay led; one or more folk from the congregation lead a service of readings and pravers. This presents an opportunity for others to get involved. Perhaps that could be you? Have a word with Gill Mason at Kilsby or Bart Springer at Barby, or myself of course. 'Many hands make light work', as the saying goes. In this case the light of Christ, the light in the darkness, which is an overarching theme through Advent to Candlemas (which will be celebrated on the last Sunday of this month in a joint service at St Faith's Kilsby). Light celebrated in all the Christmas trees in our homes and in St Mary's. A big thank you to those who helped organise that. Light is a theme that runs through the Gospels, particularly the Gospel of Luke, which is the Gospel being focused on in this Church Year. Even the name Luke references light. Perhaps that is why the writer focuses on it? The glory to the

shepherds, 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' as Simeon sings. It is certainly a theme we need to run with. Not just to get us through this dark and dreary time of the year, but to help us through the abiding darkness of the pandemic. Light engenders hope. And hope does not disappoint (Romans 5:5). It is needful for our journey through life (Palms 119: 105).

St Mary's is open during the day every day, so anyone can enter this house of prayer. I have had more than one conversation, and I have heard of others, with people who have just gone in for a few minutes and there found some peace and tranquility that has calmed their anxieties and lifted their spirits.
