Parish Council Meetings – The next meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on MONDAY 9<sup>th</sup> MAY at 7.30pm in Barby Village Hall, Kilsby Road, Barby CV23 8TT

Members of the parish are welcome to attend the parish council meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then come along and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting. <u>Annual Parish Meeting</u> - The Annual Parish Meeting, which is not a parish council meeting, but a meeting of parishioners is going to be held on **THURSDAY** 12<sup>th</sup> MAY at 7.30pm in Barby Village Hall.

This is an opportunity to hear a summary of the previous year's achievements from the parish council, and the new Unitary Authority of West Northamptonshire Council and from any parish organisations who wished to participate.

Please come along and hear what your parish councillors have achieved on behalf of the village during the first year of their four-year term of office, and what the newly formed West Northamptonshire Council has been up to. We hope that our Unitary Councillors Rosie Humphreys, Alan Chantler and Malcolm Longley will be present to answer any questions you may have.

<u>Parish notice board in Barby</u> - The parish council is going to locate the new notice board on the opposite side of the road to "Barby Village Stores" in front of the allotment hedge. This will be installed shortly, as will a new litter bin.

<u>Queens Platinum Jubilee</u> - THURSDAY 2<sup>nd</sup> to SUNDAY 5<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2022 is a long Bank Holiday weekend to allow communities to come together to celebrate 70 years of the Queen's reign.

We are very pleased to say that the parish has been successful in securing Heritage Lottery funding to cover the costs of the various activities what will be taking place over the weekend of the Jubilee.

<u>News from Onley</u> - Our Easter Egg hunt was a great success, and we sold all our tickets. We had a very good turnout of children and families, old and young, who all had a most enjoyable time.

Arrangements are still being set in place for our Jubilee Fete on Sunday 5th June at 1.00 pm onwards.

Planned already are the birds of prey display, traditional games, music, free bouncy castle, face painting, coffee van, homemade scones and cream, BBQ, ice cream and slush machine. We will have a compere for the games and many raffle prizes will be given out during the afternoon. Picnic tables are available, and we would recommend you also bring your fold up chairs along with your picnic should you wish. <u>Street lighting</u> - With the current escalating energy prices, the parish has locked into a 36-month deal for street lighting. The parish council is also getting quotes to convert the lamps at Onley Park to LED lanterns.

**Parish Council Annual Financial Return** - Each year the parish council arrange for management and control of its business in areas of book-keeping, compliance with proper practices, risk management, budget setting and monitoring and yearend procedures to be examined by an independent internal auditor. This process has been completed for the Barby & Onley Parish and the internal audit report at end of year bank reconciliation and annual return will be available on the parish website once they have been approved at the next parish council meeting. The annual return is then submitted to PKF-Littlejohn LLP for external audit and, if all is in order, this is signed off by 30<sup>th</sup> September each year.

<u>Keeping our village tidy</u> - After a very wet winter, and lots of digging by contractors, the verges were in poor condition at the start of the mowing season. Regular mowing is now underway, and they are recovering well. Please help us by not parking on grass verges. Thank you

Barby Tennis Court needs someone to over-see it - Do you enjoy playing tennis and welcome the fact that the village of Barby has a tennis court available for residents to use (free of charge)? If so, would you be prepared to check the tennis court on a regular basis and let the parish council know of any maintenance issues etc? It should not be an onerous task but would be a great help to the parish council to ensure that they are aware of any problems and can ensure the facility is maintained property so that it lasts for future generations. **Recent break-ins in Barby and neighbouring villages.** - There have been a number of shed break-ins recently with power tools being stolen. Please review your security arrangements and if anyone sees any unusual activity please report it to the police, who may be able to access information in the event of a crime from their local ANPR cameras. Data from such cameras is protected under GDPR law and may only be accessed by the police as they are the data controller. **Digging up the roads** - The contractors who are digging up the road through the village are working on behalf of Western Power Distribution (WPD) as part of a huge project to increase the electricity capacity to local villages. WPD have installed cabling from Yelvertoft and are going all the way through to Willoughby. They have installed sub-station cabinets to ensure that the power supply is sufficient for all the housing calling on it, and to prevent the number of power cuts that we have experienced over the past couple of years.

Electricity companies are not required to apply for planning permission to install the sub-station cabinets, and despite the parish council offering a corner of the Ware (which is owned by the parish) to them as a site for the cabinet, WPD deemed it unsuitable and arranged with Northamptonshire Highways to place it on their land on Rectory Lane. **New Housing Strategy** - West Northamptonshire Council is developing a new housing strategy which will be a high-level document that will explain their vision, plans and priorities for the next two years. We want to make sure that the new housing strategy covers the housing issues important to our residents and stakeholders and this can be achieved by asking you to help us shape it and we welcome your views and comments. This questionnaire closes at midnight on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> May 2022. Please visit the West Northamptonshire Consultation Hub for further information about the proposal and how to have your say.

**Parish Council Clerk** - After 30 years of supporting the Barby & Onley Parish Council in her role as Clerk, Catherine Camp is retiring at the end of May 2022.
