No Mow May

Barby and Onley Parish Council decided to take part in 'No Mow May' taking a significant step to support local biodiversity and promote environmental sustainability. No Mow May is a national campaign, run by Plantlife and supported by West Northants Council, aimed at promoting the health and well-being of pollinators, such as bees, butterflies, and other beneficial insects. By refraining from mowing during May, it allows wildflowers and grasses to flourish, providing vital habitats and food sources for these essential creatures. This initiative is a simple yet impactful way to enhance biodiversity and contribute to the global effort to protect our environment. We understand that some residents in the parish have concerns about the appearance of unmown verges or potential dog fouling issues. The Parish Council have been mindful of this and continued the mowing of the play areas in both Barby and Onley, the football pitch in Onley, the cemetery in Barby and the memorial in Barby during May. Thank you for your support for the Parish Council's commitment to a greener, more sustainable community.

Community Governance Review

The Community Governance Review Consultation is currently underway and will run until 28th July. It will seek views on the proposals that emerged from Stage One of the process. This includes things such as parish boundaries, the number of parish councillors, and potential changes to parish names. Highways Repairs

West Northants Council have informed Parish Councils that they are preparing to roll out the summer road maintenance programme, focusing on major projects that require warm and dry weather conditions. Working with their highways partner, Kier, they are carrying out various projects across West Northamptonshire, including road resurfacing, patching, improving surface drainage systems, enhancing our green spaces and increasing biodiversity, cleaning gullies, and emergency repairs. They have invested in new technology, such as the Pothole Pro machine, which they report has significantly improved the volume and quality of repairs.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan Review</u> Further progress on our Neighbourhood Plan Review has somewhat stalled over recent weeks as we have been awaiting WNC to decide if they need to carry out a full 'Environmental Assessment' on our NDP revision documentation. However, we heard last week that WNC had decided that this was not necessary and we are just awaiting their full report to confirm this.

We will then be starting regulation 14, which is when the PC submits all the NDP review documentation to a list of organisations for consultation and, most importantly, to the people living in the Parish for formal comment. There is a statutory six week period over which we need to do this and we will be publishing all the related documentation on the Parish website along with forms for people to complete and return to advise of any changes they would like to see. As soon as we are aware of when this six week consultation period will start we will put this information on the neighbourhood plan page of the Parish website plus on the Parish Facebook pages.
