## Annual Parish Meeting

Thank you to the members of the public and representatives from village organisations that attended the Annual Parish Meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> April. All of the reports provided will be published on the website. Please email the Parish Clerk if you were unable to attend the meeting but would still like a report included on the website.

**Litter** The Parish Council arranged another litter pick which took place on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April to concentrate on areas with a large amount of litter which required additional attention following the March litter pick. Thank you to those that helped.

**Dog fouling** There has been an increase in dog fouling reported around the village. Whilst the majority of dog owners pick up after their dogs there is a minority who do not which and has led to certain areas of the village seeing a persistent problem. Please can all dog owners ensure they pick up after their dogs as this poses a risk to health as well as being unpleasant.

West Northants Council officers can issue Fixed Penalty Notices ranging from £100 to £400 for environmental offences such as dog fouling.

- time, date and location of incident
- frequency of the offence, if it happens regularly
- description/breed of the dog

• any other descriptions to help identify the offender, including their name and address if known

## Speed Watch in Barby – Saturday 27th April to 25th May

Speedwatch is a scheme that provides the police details of vehicles speeding in areas where speeding is of a concern to the community. The focus is on education, Speedwatch does not lead directly to prosecution. However, by continuing with Speedwatch it ensures the village continues to have visits from the police mobile speed camera car/van on a periodic basis.

If anyone would like to join the Barby Speedwatch team and help to make a difference (or find out more information) then please contact the Speedwatch Coordinator. Sessions are flexible, planned around availability usually lasting for 1-2 hours and can be targeted to match busier times in the morning or late afternoon. We currently have dedicated core team and would welcome new volunteers.

#### **Barby Townlands and Educational Charity**

Barby Townlands and Educational Charity was created when a number of smaller local charities were amalgamated. The charity can trace its roots back to the 19th Century, but some of the covenants go back further. The Charity uses funds raised from the property it manages and investments to provide grants to local organisations that are based in or serve the residents of Barby and Onley. As well as benefiting the Parish the Charity has to protect the assets for future generations.



The charity's assets are spread throughout the village. The Play Area, the Tennis Court, and the Sports Field are leased to the Parish Council. The Allotments are managed by a trustee, and the Millennium Orchard and Petanque Pit are managed by the Charity.

The Charity also holds investments in the Charities Investment Fund, a unit trust. The charity takes a very responsible position in relation to the maintenance of the assets and

money is spent annually to ensure that what we pass on is in the best condition we can manage. The farm land beyond the sports field going down Longdown Lane is leased to a local farmer and Barby Garage, opposite the Arnold Arms, is leased to the proprietor of the garage business. Both the farm land and the garage are managed through our land agent.

## ANNUAL PARISH MEETING – Monday 15th April 2024

#### ANNUAL REPORT FROM BARBY & ONLEY PARISH COUNCIL - April 2023–31 March 2024

We currently have a full complement of 11 councillors with no changes during the year. Thank you to all those who take on the role of Councillor to try and ensure our parish is a great place to live, as we all know it is an entirely voluntary role and each councillor gives up some of their spare time for the community to make decisions that we feel benefits us all. We are very fortunate to have many volunteers in addition to the Councillors and my thanks on behalf of all the community goes out to them. A particular thank you to Christine Dover as our newsletter editor, I know a lot of the parishioners who are not online value this being delivered to households each month.

Dom Fisher has continued as Highways Liaison and Neighbourhood Watch Co-Ordinator. As residents of Barby will know as you know, the surrounding roads have been in an appalling condition for as long as most people can remember, Dom works hard trying to get urgent repairs made quickly. During Spring 2024, Parish Councillors met with representatives from West Northants Highways and whilst acknowledging their poor condition, they are not considered dangerous (debatable for many I know) and major repairs are unlikely in the short term.

A notable thanks once again goes to all the volunteers who help litter pick a few times a year, this is always well supported and makes a big different to the villages and surrounding countryside.

Thank you to the others who volunteer their time who I haven't named specifically.

#### Finances

The Parish Council Precept is the only part of your Council Tax that you can be assured is being directly spent on you and not procured into a wider area of the West Northamptonshire. It is a tiny percentage of your overall Council Tax bill and you can be assured it will be spent for your benefit and in your Parish. This year the Parish Council set a budget and requested a precept of £66,032 for the year which commenced on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024. This was a 6% rise over the previous year which is reflective of the inflationary pressures we have all faced which has had an understandable effect on our running costs.

During the year we have been able to take advantage of the currently high interest rates (compared to recent years) and re-invested some of the Onley ring-fenced funds, this will have a notable impact on how quickly they will deplete and hold their future value. Parish Council accounts are scrutinised annually by an independent verifier who checks the figures and checks that the council is operating correctly and has the necessary policies, insurance, and risk assessments in place. To ensure that we comply with governance and accountability legislation the accounts are also reviewed annually by external auditors.

## Planning

The Parish Council acts as a consultee in the planning process for any applications within our Parish. We have no direct influence, but we act in the interests of those most directly affected and carefully consider our comments based on this. Ultimately decisions on whether planning consent will be granted or not is made by the West Northamptonshire Council Planning Authority. This year the Parish has been consulted on 20 planning applications. The application to extend the shooting hours and facilities at Barby Sporting Club, which is keenly followed by many, has still not gone before the planning committee after a period or more than 2 years and we have no recent updates on it.

## Some of our achievements though the year

Very few members of the public attend the Parish Council meetings and despite the Parish Newsletter being distributed to all households and minutes being available online, it is easy to miss some of the achievements we have made through the year. Therefore, I have summarised some of how we have tried to help and benefit the community here:

• Safety works were undertaken on trees which are the responsibility of the Parish Council.

• Continued Grant support for the Cricket Club at Barby Sports Field, The Barby Woodland Trust and leasing of community land from Barby Townlands and Educational Charity.

• Play Areas in both villages have been repaired and maintained. High priority repairs in Barby have been contracted; however unfavourable weather has meant they have been unable to be completed for some time.

• Purchased additional litter picking kits for volunteer use on village litter picks.

• The trimming of the hedges around the play area and allotments was completed once the birds had finished nesting. This has been done for many years by a local farmer who kindly gives up his time for free.

• We have implemented a new accounting software package which gives us quicker access to financials so that we can better monitor our spend vs the budgets we have set throughout the year.

• Barby Meadow Woods, part supported by the Parish Council, has completed planting of approximately 7000 trees, a portion of which was community planted on a very well-attended day.

## Looking to the future

• In May 2024 volunteers from the Village will take part in Community Speedwatch, organised by Cllr Gove and his team of helpers. It has been a great success for many years and helps highlight the speeding issue we have in Barby with its positive impact clear to see.

• The revision of our Neighbourhood Development Plan is now very close to completion and just awaiting some final external consultation input. This is an incredibly time-consuming project funded by grant money and led by ClIr Gorman and a sub-committee. It will give us every opportunity to protect and shape development in the Parish for the future, in line with what the community has fed back on during public consultation with residents.


## **Clubs and Societies**

## Neighbourhood Plan Review 2023/24

The purpose of Neighbourhood Planning is to give local people greater ownership of the plans and policies that affect their local area. The intention is to empower local people to take a proactive role in shaping the future of the areas in which they live. Once in place, the plans will comprise the framework for change in that area for the next 10 to 15 years.

As you may be aware, Barby and Onley Parish Council is reviewing its neighbourhood plan. Thank you to all of you who attended the open events in the Parish in March '23 & to those that have provided comment and information since.

Throughout 2023 the Neighbourhood Plan Review Team has put together their suggested draft for the review document to be submitted to WNC for their assessment. There are many stages to WNC's assessment process which will take around 3-6 months.

Our recent survey received 111 responses - thank you to everyone who took the time to let us know their opinion on the plan so far. We will be providing further information on the plan's submission route in the near future.
