Chairman's Message

West Northants Council is undertaking a review of the Grand Union/Oxford Canal Conservation Area between Braunston and Stowehill, including the Leicester and Northampton Arms. An online presentation for interested parties and members of the public will be held on Thursday 21st November 6.30-7.30pm to explain about the review and provide the opportunity to ask questions. Anyone interested in attending the online presentation can register their place by emailing heritage@westnorthants.gov.uk

Planning Applications Planning decisions are made by West Northamptonshire Council although the Parish Council is consulted on most applications. Details appear on the parish council website and in the minutes of meetings whenever the Parish Council has been consulted on an application within the Parish. For full details of all planning applications please visit the planning portal on the West Northamptonshire Council website: https://www.westnorthants.gov.uk/planningapplications-and-enforcement/view-and-comment-planning-application concerns that the Parish Council had with West Northants Council's (WNC) decision to grant planning permission at Toft Hill, Barby (2024/0993/FULL) legal advice was sought..Our legal advisors identified grounds that would support a Judicial Review and asked West Northants Council to consent to judgment in a formal letter before action. Even though WNC agreed that they had made mistakes with regard to their procedures and that they had interpreted planning policy incorrectly, they would not concede to judgement. Consequently, the only option available to the Parish Council was to take court action against them which was considered to be too great a burden upon the Parish's financial resources.

Please be assured that the Parish Council will do whatever it feasible can to ensure that WNC take into account Parishioners' views and adhere to all planning rules, procedures and regulations in the making of their planning decisions

Wildflower Areas The Barby Gardening Club has most kindly taken over the maintenance and management of the wildflower areas in Barby. The area by the cherry trees has been sown with yellow rattle in preparation for future wildflowers to be planted.and the area by the bench on Ware Rd will be planted with perennial wildflowers and daffodils as well as two smoke bushes. Thank you, most sincerely, to the Gardening Club - we are all very grateful to you.

Budget Over the coming weeks, the Parish Council will be formulating its budget for the next financial year. If there are any projects within the Parish that you would like us to consider then please let me know.

Speed Calming We hope to initiate a speed calming measure in Daventry Road, Barby in the next financial year - more details to follow when available.
