At the July 2024 Parish Council meeting, Paul stood down as a Councillor. He will be sorely missed! <u>Road Closure</u> We have been advised that part of Onley Lane will be closed on 7th October to allow Anglian Water to exchange a meter.

<u>Grass Cuttings</u> There has been a report of someone dumping grass cuttings on Council land at Onley. Please remember to use your brown bin for garden waste rather than illegally dumping the waste. It is an offense and you could be prosecuted.

<u>Rugby Half Marathon</u> The Rugby Half Marathan will take place on Sunday 20th October 2024, starting and finishing at Hart Field. The race start time will be 9:30am and the event will finish by 12:30pm. The following road closures will be in place:

Ashlawn Road westbound - 08:30-10:45

Barby Lane - 08:45-11:15

The organisers have stated that advanced warning signs will be in place 2 weeks prior to the event, warning of disruptions between 08:30am and 01:00pm on the day of the run and that impacted residents will be sent a letter explaining in more detail exact timings throughout the route 4 weeks prior to the event. There will also be a residents' hotline and information section on the website for impacted residents. The organisers have also advised that that they would actively like to support any local causes with charity places and welcome any local causes to get in touch and receive free charity spots for the run. Allotments

Some of the allotments are looking great and obviously a lot of hard work is being done. However, very sadly, some are a complete mess with grass and weeds being allowed to grow rampant. This is extremely inconsiderate and clearly has a **very negative impact** on those keeping their plots in good order, and it is "hogging" a plot that could be used by someone who really wants one and who would genuinely take care of it. Can I ask that if your plot is overgrown you urgently cut back the weeds & grass and if you can't dig over immediately then you cover with weed suppressant fabric/black plastic until you have time to tend to it properly. The Townlands Charity already financially supports many village groups & initiatives and we simply do not have the funds to have to pay someone to clear neglected plots.

Also note: the leaking tap is being attended to by the water provider - sorry slow progress on that! The wooden boards forming the boundaries are being assessed for repair.

Please remember that as per the rental agreement you are expected to keep the paths bordering onto your plots tidy & weed free. And please refrain from trimming back other people's plants unless agreed in advance! Thank you!
