Parish Council Vacancies

The Parish Council has two vacancies for Parish Councillors to be filled by co-option. If you would like to apply or for further details please contact the Parish Clerk.

At the time of writing the Parish Council has not received any more updates regarding the water pipe replacement at Onley. As soon as there is any further feedback we will update all Onley residents. The Parish Council has also escalated the issues surrounding the current water charging procedures at Onley to our MP, Stuart Andrews, who has made representations on our behalf to the MOJ.

The Parish Council (PC) contracted a Parish tradesman to carry out some work to help reduce potential flooding in Rugby Road, Barby The work has been carried out using money from a flood grant that the PC obtained.

The PC have also contracted another Parish tradesman to replace the fence and repair the gate at Barby tennis court.

We have been working with West Northants Council (WNC) highways department to try to get them to resolve many of the potholes and road defects in the Parish. WNC now have a new machine & methodology for repairing potholes and this has been used on Cart Hill, Barby. It will be interesting to see if these new procedures are more effective than those used previously. We have also had several meetings with WNC regarding the condition of Barby Lane and the urgent need for the whole road to be refurbished. WNC tell us that due to their budget restraints this is unlikely to happen for some time, hence we will need to continue to report potholes & individual defects in the road. The PC were involved in getting some repairs to the edge of the road near the Rugby border repaired recently

The Parish Council wants to hear from Parishioners as to how they would like the PC to improve the Parish. As always Parishioners are welcome to raise any problems with the PC at our monthly council meetings. Members of the PC will also be at the Barby Produce Show on Sunday 31st August & The Onley Family Fun Day on 6th September – so please do come to speak to us regarding any issues or improvements you would like to see around the Parish.

Heritage and haute couture will combine in a centenary display of fashion and textiles at Rugby's Percival Guildhouse in September as part of National Heritage Weekend.

The major display of 100 years of fashion will include 1920s flapper dresses, wartime clothing, mid-century designs, 1960s' miniskirts, 1970s' psychedelic colours and punk fashion, plus a range of textiles from different decades and how they were used in our living rooms.

Visitors during the weekend of 13th-14th September, will also be able to view precious artefacts from the Guildhouse Archive collection. Such is the significance of this material, charting 100 years of adult education, that it has attracted National Lottery Heritage Funding to enable all material to be preserved and digitised for future generations.

The Guildhouse will be open between 11am-3pm during Heritage Weekend.
