In order to clear the vegetation between the back of the garages and the Orchard in Onley, can all residents please remove any items, including trailers, from this area. Any items left in this area, after a few weeks, will be removed & disposed of.

At the request of the Parish Council our MP, Stuart Andrew, wrote to Lord Timpson, Minister for Prisons, regarding the delays in organising the new water charging process for Onley residents until Severn Trent take over invoicing. Lord Timpson replied that a new procedure was being drawn up by the MOJ but it was taking longer than anticipated. Lord Timpson confirmed that the MOJ would take any cases of financial difficulty into consideration when a new payment scheme is eventually implemented.

Thank you to Cllr Sarah Withington and team for organising the very enjoyable Onley Fun Day on 6th September – a good time was had by all & over £670 was raised for Onley Village Hall.

The Parish Council has contracted a local tradesman to clear some of the vegetation & brambles from the Ware in Barby. We have also applied for a grant to replace the two speed indicator devices on Daventry Road, Barby with more up-to-date and clearer devices.

Thank you to Cllr Phil Wagg for all his work around Barby in cutting back weeds/overgrowth from paths and in organising flood defences


