Annual Parish Council Meeting The Parish Council held its Annual Parish Council Meeting at Onley Village Hall on 12<sup>th</sup> May. Cllr Faith Gorman was re-elected as Chair of the Parish Council and Cllr Sarah Withington was re-elected as Vice-Chair of the Parish Council. The Parish Council agreed to continue to hold meetings on the second Monday of each month, except for August where a meeting will only be held if there are any urgent matters. The meetings will be held at Barby Village Hall at 7.30pm except in May and November when they will be held at Onley Village Hall.



The Neighbourhood Development Plan Our Parish Neighbourhood Development plan passed referendum on 1st May 2025. West Northants Council will now use our plan to help them decide all planning applications within our Parish. This means that going forward, the views of local people should be taken into account in all planning decisions in Barby & Onley. Thank you to everyone who voted in the referendum. The turnout was high, 43.65% of those registered to vote in the Parish did vote in the referendum and 89.26% of those that voted, voted YES. This is a tremendous achievement for the Parish and I would like to thank everyone who worked so very hard in putting the plan together.

All of us on the Parish Council want to improve our Parish for our whole community but we cannot do this without your feedback. Please do let us know what you would like to see the Council doing to improve our Parish. Our direct powers are limited but we do spend a lot of time arranging for West Northants Council to make improvements for the benefit of us all. Please do let me know how you would like the Parish Council to improve where we all live.




