

Parish Council News (Parish Clerk 07864 579068)

The Parish Council continues to meet on the second Monday of each month except when it falls on a bank holiday. The next meeting will take place on Monday 10th February at 7.30pm at Barby Village Hall. Members of the parish are welcome to join the meeting and raise any issues they wish during the period of public participation at the beginning of the meeting. Street Watch Northamptonshire Police has launched an initiative called Street Watch which involves volunteers from the community undertaking "patrols" to identify issues that may be affecting the local area. They state that "Other Villages that have undertaken this Scheme have utilised dog walkers, or their own specific fitness schedules. The view will be that you can identify issues and link in with your local Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) for a positive and efficient resolution locally identified issues or concerns." Chief Inspector Dave Wakeman, who is coordinating the relaunch of the Street Watch in Northamptonshire, explained more about the programme. He said: "Street Watch is based on a very simple idea - it's about going for a walk with your neighbours, getting to know people in the area, being a visible presence to help deter crime and anti-social behaviour and generally building up a greater sense of community spirit. Each scheme is led by a coordinator - a volunteer who will lead the team and liaise with their neighbourhood officers to get information about things to look out for or areas to focus on, and also to be able to provide feedback from their patrols. We ask for a commitment of at least two hours a month but volunteers can do as much as they like. All we ask is that there are at least two people on each walk for safety and we provide a high visibility jacket with "Street Watch" on it so people know they are part of an organised group."



Overgrown hedges The Parish Council commonly receives complaints about overgrown vegetation impinging on the roads or footpaths. Hedges and other vegetation are the responsibility of the landowner and the Parish Council would kindly ask all residents in both Barby and Onley to check for any overgrowing vegetation that might be impinging on footpaths or roads and take measures to cut these back.

Pavement parking Please can drivers kindly ensure that they do not park on the pavements in Barby or Onley as this can restrict access on the pavements for pedestrians especially those with pushchairs or wheelchairs and can result in pedestrians having to walk into the roads when pavements are obstructed.

<u>**Road closure**</u> The Parish Council has been notified that Part of Barby Road will be closed between 17-28th March to allow Anglian Water to divert a mains.



20mph speed signs As you may have seen, the Parish Council have had some advisory 20mph speed signs placed around the Parish to alert motorists that driving at 30 mph in certain areas may not be appropriate. To avoid driver complacency these signs will be moved, periodically, to different locations within the Parish. The instigation of speed calming measures in Daventry Road, Barby is still on track from April 2025.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan Review</u> The independent examination of our Neighbourhood Plan Review (NDP) began on 25th November 2024 after the completion of the regulation 16 process. 


