Grand Union Canal Consultation

West Northamptonshire Council will be running a public consultation on the draft Grand Union and Oxford Canal Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Plan, starting on Monday 16th June 2025.

The consultation will run for six weeks from **Monday 16th June to midnight on Sunday 27th July 2025**, during which time representations must be made in writing to West Northamptonshire Council, either by

Thank you to all the residents who have taken the time to trim back their overgrown hedges where they have been impinging on footpaths. The Parish Council writes to householders from time to time where an issue has been identified and are grateful for the prompt action taken in these instances. The Parish Council also continues to report matters for which West Northamptonshire Council is responsible to them.

Fix My Street

There will be a meeting on Wednesday 2nd July, 6-8pm in Onley Village Hall for the Companies involved in the installation of the new freshwater pipes in Onley to provide information to Onley residents about their plans. We do hope that as many Onley residents as possible will be able to come to the meeting and/or submit questions in advance.

The Parish Council have replaced the bench & the bin on The Ware in Barby. We have contracted local tradespeople to cut the hedge in front of the tennis court and to repair the fence and gate around the court. After much persistence, we finally got West Northants Council (WNC) to repair the pipe that was believed to be causing the water leak in Church Walk. The water was flowing over the pavement and creating a sheet of ice in cold weather. Our thanks go to Cllr Phil Wagg for repairing and revarnishing some of the benches in Barby and for cutting back hedges for easier access to dog poo bins.

The Parish Council have formed a working party to update our Parish website - further information will be provided on this over the forthcoming months.

The Parish Council have met with West Northants Council to start the planning of a traffic calming scheme in Daventry Road, Barby. As mentioned previously, WNC do not install 'road humps/sleeping policeman' or speed cameras so their proposal will likely be for a chicane and maybe an additional 'pinch point' junction. Once WNC have finalised their proposals there will be a public consultation process as this is a very big project for our Parish. However, I wanted to let you know that the Daventry Road traffic calming project proposal is at least now underway.

Parishioners are always welcome to come to our Parish Council meetings; our next meeting is at 7.30pm on Monday 14th July at Barby Village Hall. Members of the Parish Council will also be attending the Barby Church fete on 29th June. Please do come to speak to us about any issues in the Parish or let us know what you would like to see the Parish Council working on going forward. Speed Watch in Barby – Saturday 26th July to 30th August

Speedwatch is a scheme run by local community volunteers supported by the Parish Council and organised by Northamptonshire Police; it provides the Police details of vehicles identified as speeding within the village. Speedwatch does not lead directly to prosecution, however, by continuing with Speedwatch it ensures the village continues to have visits from the Police mobile speed camera car/van on a periodic basis.


Speedwatch works through a team of volunteers using Police speed recording equipment to record the details of vehicles speeding at agreed strategic locations within the village. With the support of the Parish Council data is submitted to Northamptonshire Police where vehicles are recorded by the Speedwatch team exceeding the 30mph limit. The driver of every vehicle reported as speeding will receive an official warning letter from the Police explaining the importance of adhering to speed limits. If a driver is reported to be significantly exceeding the speed limit or has been reported more than once the driver may have further action taken by Police.

If anyone would like to join the Barby Speedwatch team and help to make a difference (or find out more information) then please contact me. Sessions are flexible, planned around availability usually lasting for 1-2 hours and can be targeted to match busier times in the morning or late afternoon.

We currently have a small dedicated core team and would be delighted to welcome new volunteers to help run this year's sessions.

Other Notices


