Thank you to every organisation, club & charity that either submitted or gave a report at our Annual Parish Meeting – it was most interesting to hear about so many activities that are happening within the Parish.

The referendum for our Parish Neighbourhood Plan is taking place along with the Local Council elections on 1st May. You will be able to vote for both at the same time. If you are registered for a postal vote you should have received your referendum voting paper along with your Local Council election form already. If more Parishioners vote YES at the referendum than vote NO, then our neighbourhood plan (which was drafted from the Parishioners' views as to how they want to see the Parish develop) will be used by West Northants Council in planning decisions made in the Parish.

Dogs must be kept on leads at all times on the Sports Field (Barby Cricket Club), they are only allowed on the area around the clubhouse & along the edge of the field by the hedge adjacent to Longdown Lane. Please do not take your dog around the field or onto the playing area. Please also clean up after your dog, placing any bags in a dog poo bin and not in one of the Cricket Club rubbish bins.

We do currently have **two vacancies for Parish Councillors**. You do not need to have any experience, just a desire to improve & support your community. We meet once per month and Councillors are also involved in other projects within the Parish. Report from the Parish Council for Barby & Onley Annual Parish Meeting 14th April 2025

The past year saw the resignation from the Parish Council of our Chair, Paul Reynolds, & Vice Chair, Steve Gee. On behalf of all Councillors and the Parish our grateful thanks go to Paul & Steve for all their hard work & dedication to our communities over many years. The Parish is a much poorer place without their experience and wisdom on the Council.

Over the summer I was elected Chair of the Parish Council & Sarah Withington was elected Vice Chair and we welcomed Councillors Kirsty Towney & Thomas Hallam who were co-opted into the vacant seats left by Paul & Steve.

Thank you to all those who take on the role of Councillor; it is most rewarding working alongside a group of Councillors with a shared vision for improving the Parish for our whole community.

All the work that Councillors undertake is entirely voluntary and we all give up a considerable amount of our spare time to work to improve our communities.

To reiterate, sincere thanks to all Councillors over the past year and our sincere thanks to our Clerk, Katrina, for all of her hard work & support.

Our grateful thanks also go to Christine Dover, editor of the Parish newsletter, without whose time and dedication, the newsletter would not be published every month. Thank you to Dom Fisher for all his work in the Parish to improve our roads and to Gavin Callard for all his help and advice on environmental issues. We are most fortunate that the list of volunteers who carry out work within the Parish is extensive, so thank you to all our volunteers for your hard work to make our community a better place for us all to live.

In November, the Parish Council set its budget & requested a precept of £73,605 for the financial year starting on 1st April 2025. Due to prudent financial control, we were able to request this level of precept which is just a 2% increase over last year's figure. This is the lowest percentage increase there has been for many years.

It is projected that we have ended the March 2025 financial year with a surplus and well within budget, consequently we are able to commit further funds to reserves for future community projects. Over the past year the Council has consolidated Parish bank accounts and moved Parish funds into further interest-bearing accounts. The new budget & the previous year's expenditure have been published in the newsletter & on our website.

Planning decisions are made by West Northants Council, although the Parish Council is a consultee. During the past year the Parish Council was consulted on 11 planning applications; 5 of which we raised objections to due their impact upon the Parish. All of these applications, that have been determined so far, have been approved by West Northants Council despite our objections.

In September the Parish Council took legal advice over the procedural errors and incorrect interpretation of planning policy made by West Northants Council in the determination of the Toft Hill planning application in Barby.

The revision of our Neighbourhood Development plan, that the Parish Council has been formulating over the past 2 years, passed independent external examination in February and will go to Parish referendum on 1st May. If a majority vote YES to our Neighbourhood Plan, it will become part of the statutory Development Plan for West Northants. Any planning decisions on housing and the environment, within the Parish, will then be made with reference to our revised Neighbourhood Plan which has been drawn up from feedback received from Parishioners as to how they wish to see the Parish develop.

During the past year the Parish Council organised the community speed watch programme and have obtained & placed advisory 20 mph speed signs around the Parish. In addition, we are working with West Northants Council to improve traffic signage on Cart Hill, Barby.

Over the past twelve months, the Parish Council has worked very hard to improve and assist our communities; time would not allow me to list all of our achievements tonight so I will mention just a few -

- We arranged for the footpath by the Derry in Barby to be cleared and the trees & shrubs overhanging the footpath to be cut back.
- We have purchased two new litter bins for Onley & are purchasing a new litter bin & a bench for the Ware in Barby.
- We arranged for the Barby village sign on the road into Barby from Daventry to be repaired.
- We gave grants to Barby Meadow Woods to purchase & install a dog poo bin and a grant to the Cricket Club for grass mowing at the sports field.
- We have also just awarded a grant to Barby village hall to assist with the cost of purchasing new chairs.
- We negotiated and entered into a new management agreement with the Cricket Club for their continued use of the Sports field.
- We now have a Parish Council representative on the board of Trustees at Barby Townlands Educational Charity, to improve communication between our organisations and to ensure BTEC have representation at the Parish Council.
- We arranged for the footpath from the top of Elkington Lane down to Dunchurch Marina, one of the paths that joins our two communities, to be cleared and for the stile and bridge over the stream to be repaired.

- Cllr Phil Wagg spent a considerable amount of his own time cutting back hedges & tidying up the small park in School Close, Barby for the benefit of us all
- The Parish Council are very grateful to the Barby and Onley Gardening Club for agreeing to take care of the wild flower area in Barby and for planting bulbs and shrubs around the bench on the Ware.
- On Remembrance Sunday, I had the honour of placing a wreath on behalf of the Parish Council and all Parishioners at our Parish war memorial.

Going forward we have already started to establish our plans for further community improvements, which include -

- Traffic calming measures in Daventry Road, Barby.
- Having the water leak issue in Church Walk, resolved.
- Looking into a new children's playground facility for Onley & changing the play area surface in Barby.
- Updating the Parish website & transitioning to gov.uk email addresses for Councillors in accordance with good practice.

As a Parish Council we are aiming to have greater integration within our communities so we can ensure that the decisions we make are in accordance with Parishioners' wishes. One very positive way that we have started doing this is Councillors attending the breakfast club in Barby to obtain feedback from residents.

We have utilised this feedback in Council decision making and have resolved many of the problems reported to us and are working to resolve others. We appreciate how important it is to find out first hand from residents how they want the Council to improve the Parish

As a Parish Council we are here to serve our Community.

I would like to finish by thanking everyone within our Parish who gives up their time to improve our Communities & to make our Parish such a wonderful place to live.



LODGE FARM DEVELOPMENT

Rugby Borough Council (RBC) are considering sites to build around 3,500 new homes, over the next 5 years. One option that may be considered is Lodge Farm again. If this huge development went ahead it would mean over 2,500 new homes being built around Onley Village and on the other side of the A45. This would significantly impact on our road system especially through Dunchurch village and would ruin our Countryside forever. RBC are consulting on their proposals until 19th May 2025. You can send an objection against the Lodge Farm Development directly to RBC using localplan@rugby.gov.uk or come along to one of our drop in sessions to sign one of our objection template letters (there are several to choose from). Drop-in sessions are being held in Onley Village Hall on Sunday 27th April 3.30-5.30 and in Barby Village Hall on Monday 28th April from 5:30 to 7:30.

Neighbourhood Plan Review

Referendum to take place on 1st May 2025

What is the Neighbourhood Plan?

In simple terms it is a document that:

- Sets out policies that are to be used by West Northants Council when deciding on planning applications in the Parish - so it carries real legal weight.
- Has been developed by the local community, rather than West Northants Council, and therefore reflects the priorities and wishes of people living and working in the Parish as far as possible within the context of planning regulations and requirements.

What is the question on the Ballot Paper?

'Do you want West Northants Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan Review for the Parish of Barby & Onley to help it decide planning applications?'

What would a YES vote mean?

If a simple majority vote YES to the Plan in the Referendum, it will become part of the statutory Development Plan for West Northants. Any planning decisions and conditions e.g. on housing and the environment, within our Parish must be made with reference to our Neighbourhood Plan Review.

What would a NO vote mean?

If a simple majority vote NO to the Plan, the local protections and conditions stated in the Policies will not apply and West Northants Council will continue to make planning decisions based upon County-wide and national policies.
